



## Notice of AGM and Election Guidelines for Nomination for the Palliative Care NSW Management Committee

The Management Committee of Palliative Care New South Wales (PCNSW) is inviting nominations from PCNSW members who are willing to contribute to the governance of PCNSW and its work, to ensure that all people with a life limiting illness and their families are supported to live, die and grieve well.

The Management Committee is seeking new members who can expand or enhance its mix of skills, experience and diversity, and who are able to contribute demonstrated:

- experience in governance;
- strategic thinking;
- experience in palliative care and end of life care in relation to chronic illness, aged care, disability care, and / or primary health care;
- experience in government relations, policy and advocacy;
- personal values that are consistent with the values of PCNSW.

At the PCNSW **Annual General Meeting to be held on Friday 4 November 2022**, an election will be conducted for the following Management Committee positions:

- Treasurer
- Secretary
- Up to seven (7) General Members

All positions are for a two-year term. The President Elect shall assume the role of President at the AGM and the current President shall assume the role of Vice President/Immediate Past President, therefore those positions are not up for election at this time.

The Management Committee meets face to face or via zoom once per month, for approximately two hours to discuss PCNSW's strategic direction, financial position, policies and other matters of importance. Papers for meetings are distributed electronically beforehand to allow members to prepare.

The primary role of the Management Committee is one of trusteeship on behalf of its members, ensuring that the organisation remains viable and effective in the present and into the future. The Management Committee is accountable for all PCNSW organisational and strategic matters. All decisions are made collectively by the Management Committee and all Management Committee members share equal responsibility for those decisions.

A Management Committee position at PCNSW offers the opportunity to share in the decision making of a dynamic peak health organisation. Management Committee members work in a collaborative environment and share in the achievements of the organisation. There is an expectation that members of the Management Committee will contribute their time and expertise outside of the set monthly meetings to some extent.

All financial members of Palliative Care New South Wales are eligible to stand as a candidate or nominate a candidate for these positions.

Nominations must be made in writing via email, signed by 2 current members of PCNSW and accompanied by the written consent of the candidate (which may be endorsed on the form of nomination).
